“A New Era in Dentistry: HIV Screening in the Dental Chair”

Synopsis: Join the new era of dentistry-provide an HIV screening for your patients. Frequently the only point of entry into health care for some patients is your chair. As a public health service you can provide your patients vital health information during a regularly scheduled appointment. Testing in the chair enables the patient to determine their HIV status and with your assistance it affords them the opportunity to access other necessary health care services for better outcomes. Through this course you will meet the following objectives:

- Recognize the importance of offering HIV screening to dental patients
- Be cognizant of NYS requirements for HIV screening
- Be able to describe the screening tool, explain what the preliminary results mean as well as participate in a demonstration of the tool.

While at Open Door, she served positions as Chronic Disease Case Manager, Chronic Care Coordinator, and HIV Director. Currently, Denise serves as Public Health Account Manager for OraSure Technologies.

Serene Mastrianni, RPh is a public health advocate for OraSure Technologies, Inc. She is responsible for assisting medical and community-based facilities in NYS with implementing and initiating point of care screening programs for both HIV and HCV. Serene joined OraSure Technologies, Inc. in 2006, prior to that she worked for 13 years at GlaxoSmithKline specifically focusing on the treatment of HIV/AIDS.



Official Minutes of the March 2012 Dutchess County Dental Society Executive Board Meeting

The Executive Board of the Dutchess County Dental Society met on February 28th, 2012 at Greenbaum and Gilhooley's Restaurant in Wappingers Falls, New York. This meeting was originally scheduled for March but re-scheduled due to a conflict with the Ninth District meeting. Board members present were: Drs. Kirtland, Bonavoglia, Schwartz, Michael Manasar, Kaplan, Walters, Prunty, Ackerman, Rosenbloom, Smith, Miller, Rose Mason, Mark Mason, Bloom, Costello, Baum.

Call to order at 6:45pm

The February 2012 Executive board minutes were accepted.

President's Report: Dr. Bonavoglia reminded the board that he will attend the Ninth District Board of Governors meeting in May, 2012. The Council on Addiction Prevention contacted the DCDS to offer their support. The board agreed that contact information for the Council be placed on the DCDS website. Dr. Prunty agreed to do this. Dr. Bonavoglia suggested having the Council speak at a GMM sometime next year, possibly in the winter when it is convenient to have a local speaker.

Secretary's Report: Dr. Mike Schwartz reports that Dr. Gary Leinkram is working on the Children's Dental Health Month poster. The board suggested that next year this gets placed on the agenda earlier. The board is going to ask permission of the winner of the poster contest to post their poster on the website.

Treasurer Report: Dr. Richard Rosenbloom reports that approximately 90% of the membership has renewed their dues. 100% of the bulletin advertisers are paid to date. Dr. Rosenbloom asked the board what to do in a case where the ADA has issued a member of the DCDS financial hardship and waived their annual dues. The board decided that if the ADA has determined financial hardship, we will also honor this and waive the annual dues for any member in this situation. A motion was made and the board also decided that any such member be given the subsidy at the GMM meetings. Dr. Rosenbloom also announced that we will again be sponsoring the Dutchess County Regional Science fair, a total cost of \$200.00.

Membership Committee: The board voted that Dr. Bailey be moved from active to honorary membership, as he does not live or work in DC.

Bulletin Committee: Dr. Michael Manasar announced that the deadline for the April Bulletin is Wednesday, March 15th.

Website Committee: The board suggested that the DCDS facebook page be controlled by the Website Committee. Dr. Prunty will contact Dr. Sorrentino to gain access to the facebook page.

Advertisers Status: Dr. Michael Manasar reports that he is working on putting a file together thanking all advertisers. This file will be stored on a flash drive and placed on the overhead screen during the cocktail hour of all GMMs. Innodent laboratory has expressed interest in becoming an advertiser for the bulletin.

Steward's Report: Dr. Costello reports that the March venue is the Poughkeepsie Grand.

Nominating Committee: Dr. Tom Bloom announced new positions for the proposed slate for next year: President: Kole Miller; Vice President: Kelly Walters; Corresponding Secretary: Mike Schwartz; Recording Secretary: Erin Prunty; Members at Large: Allan Ackerman, John Bibko, Rose Mason, Bo Paunovic, Steve Kaplan, and Ed Riggins.

Major CE committee: Dr. Mark Mason announced that we have 19 vendors for the 2012 meeting. Phillips



Dutchess County Players: Dr. Tom Bloom reports that there is one more skit scheduled for St. Joseph's School in Millbrook. Dr. Rose Mason was able to get a donation of coloring books, toothpaste, and 300 toothbrushes from Crest. Unfortunately the NYS Dental Foundation Grant that the players applied for was denied.

Hall of Fame Committee: The recipient of the award this year will be Dr. Michael J. Schwartz, of Fishkill.

New Business: A motion was made to change the DCDS bylaws to specify that there must be 7-10 DCDS Executive Board Meetings per year. The board voted unanimously to take the necessary steps to change the bylaws. If the membership agrees to this change in bylaws, there will be a vote to hold 8 Executive Board meetings for the next year. Also in new business, Dr. Bloom and Dr. Kirtland presented at Poughkeepsie Day School on February 10th on "The Science and Politics of Fluoride." The presentation went well and the board is proud that their members are taking their time out to educate the public on this matter.
